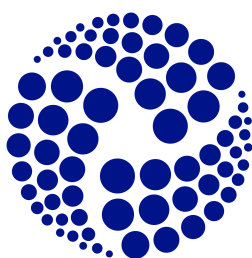

## JAMIE OLIVER'S EGGY BREAD MUFFINS

"These lovely little muffins are a great way to use up stale bread while providing a perfectly balanced bite. Pack in the veg for extra goodness.

Enjoy!"

Makes 12, takes 45 minutes plus chopping, not too tricky

### INGREDIENTS

- 400g Mediterranean veg
- 150g leafy green veg
- 25ml vegetable oil
- 400g white or brown stale bread
- 8 free range eggs
- 350ml milk
- 125g hard cheese

*Recipe kindly shared by the Tesco Community Cookery School with Jamie Oliver. The recipe has been written to be flexible and scalable up to 50 portions. Note: all veg weights are for trimmed, prepped vegetables.*

### METHOD

1. Preheat the oven to 180 degrees/gas 4
2. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with paper cases or 15 cm folded squares of greaseproof paper.
3. Roughly chop the Mediterranean veg into small pieces. Trim and finely shred the leafy greens
4. Heat a pan large enough to hold all the vegetables on a medium heat with the oil
5. Cook the chopped veg until softened and golden, then stir through the leafy greens and cook for a few minutes more, or until wilted. Remove from the heat and leave to cool a little.
6. Roughly chop the bread into small cubes and place into a large bowl
7. Whisk the eggs with the milk until combined. Pour half the egg mixture over the cubed bread, then grate in the cheese and give everything a good mix. Set aside for 10 minutes, or until the bread has absorbed all the egg.
8. Stir the cooled veg through the eggy bread, season with a little sea salt and black pepper, then divide the mixture between the

prepared muffin cases, topping each one up with the remaining beaten egg.

9. Bake for 25 minutes or until golden and set. Enjoy warm from the oven or at room temperature.



Tips – if you have any leftover muffins, simply pop them in the fridge to enjoy the following day.

## **JAMIE OLIVER' S CHOCOLATE CHIP MUFFINS**

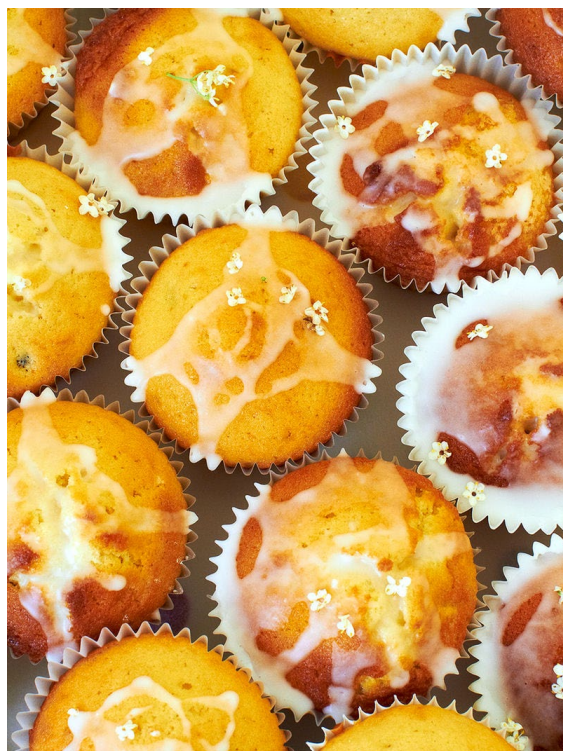
Makes 15, takes 45 minutes, Not too tricky

### **INGREDIENTS**

- Olive or rapeseed oil
- 375g plain flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 10 teaspoons unsalted butter
- 200g sugar
- 2 large free range eggs
- 360ml natural yoghurt
- 2 generous handfuls of chocolate chips

### **POMEGRANATE ICING**

- 1 splash of pomegranate juice
- 2 tablespoons icing sugar



### **METHOD**

1. Preheat the oven 190 degrees/gas 5. Grease your muffin tins lightly with oil
2. Sieve the flour, baking powder and soda, and ½ teaspoon of sea salt and set aside
3. In a large bowl, cream the butter and sugar together, beating until fluffy. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating until incorporated.
4. Beat in half of the dry ingredients until just mixed, followed by one-third of the yoghurt. Then beat in half of the remaining dry ingredients, followed by another third of the yoghurt. Beat in the remaining dry ingredients and yoghurt. Do not over beat.
5. Fold in the chocolate chips. Distribute the muffin batter equally among the cup and bake for 25 to 30 minutes, until golden brown.
6. Turn out onto a wire rack and leave to cool
7. For the icing, add the pomegranate juice to the icing sugar and mix together to form a thick paste. When the muffins have cooled, top with icing and sprinkle with fresh elderflowers, if in season.

## JAMIE OLIVER' S MINESTRONE SOUP

“Hearty and nutritious, minestrone soup is a tasty crowd-pleaser and is super-easy to tweak according to the vegetables you have in the house.”

8 portions, takes 1 hour 20 minutes, Super Easy

### INGREDIENTS

- 1 clove of garlic
- 1 red onion
- 2 carrots
- 2 sticks of celery
- 1 courgette
- 1 small leek
- 1 large potato
- 1 x 400g tin of cannellini beans
- 2 rashers of smoked streaky bacon (optional)
- Olive oil
- ½ teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 fresh bay leaf
- 2 x 400g tins of plum tomatoes
- 1 litre organic vegetable stock
- 1 large handful of seasonal greens – savoy cabbage, curly kale, chard
- 100g wholemeal pasta
- ½ a bunch of fresh basil, optional
- Parmesan

### Method

1. Peel and finely chop the garlic and onion. Trim and roughly chop the carrots, celery and courgette, then add the vegetables to a large bowl.
2. Cut the ends off the leek, quarter it lengthways, wash it under running water, then cut into 1cm slices. Add to the bowl.
3. Scrub and dice the potato. Drain the cannellini beans, then set aside. Finely slice the bacon.



4. Heat 2 teaspoons of oil in a large saucepan over a medium heat. Add the bacon and fry gently for 2 minutes, or until golden.
5. Add the garlic, onion, carrots, celery, courgette, leek, oregano and bay and cook slowly for about 15 minutes, or until the vegetables have softened, stirring occasionally.
6. Add the potato, cannellini beans and plum tomatoes, then pour in the vegetable stock. Stir well, breaking up the tomatoes with the back of the spoon.
7. Cover with a lid and bring everything slowly to the boil, then simmer for about 30 minutes, or until the potato is cooked through. Meanwhile.....
8. Remove and discard any tough stalks bits from the greens, then roughly chop.
9. Using a rolling pin, bash the pasha into piece while its still in the packet or wrap in a clean paper towel.
10. To check the potato is cooked, pierce a chunk of it with a sharp knife – if soft it's done.
11. Add the greens and pasta to the pan, and cook for a further 10 minutes, or until the pasta is al dente – soft enough to eat but still have a bit of bite.
12. Add a splash more stock or water to loosen, if needed.
13. Pick over the basil leaves (if using) and stir through. Season to taste with sea salt and black pepper, then serve with a grating of parmesan and a slice of wholemeal bread if you like.



# JAMIE OLIVER' S ROASTED CHICKEN BREAST WITH LEMONY BOMBAY POTATOES

Enjoy a lovely roast any day of the week with this quick and easy recipe

Recipe for 1 person, 55 minutes, Super Easy

## INGREDIENTS

- 200g of potatoes
- ¼ teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 lemon
- A few sprigs of fresh coriander
- ½ red pepper
- 2cm piece of ginger
- 1 free-range chicken breast
- Olive Oil



## METHOD

1. Preheat the oven to 200 degrees/gas 6
2. Peel and chop the potato into 2.5cm cubes. Cook in boiling salted water for 6 minutes, then drain well and steam dry
3. Add the turmeric and cumin to a bowl, then grate in half the lemon zest. Pick, roughly chop and add the coriander leaves.
4. Deseed and roughly chop the pepper and peel and matchstick the ginger, then add to the bowl.
5. Cut 2 sliced of lemon and set aside. Squeeze a little juice from the remainder of the lemon into the bowl.
6. Shake the potatoes up in the colander and add them to the bowl, along with the chicken. Drizzle with oil and season with sea salt and pepper, then toss everything around to coat.
7. Remove the chicken from the bowl, then tip the potatoe mixture into a baking dish (roughly 10cmx15cm) and spread out into a single layer. Top with the lemon sliced, then drape over the chicken.
8. Drizzle with oil, then cook in the middle of the oven for 25 minutes, or until golden and cooked through.

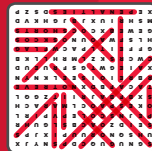

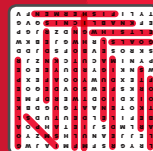

## ONE TO DO WITH THE GRANDCHILDREN

### CRUMPET PIZZAS BY CASSIE BEST

Help younger children make these easy pizzas for lunch, or let older children put them together themselves. Use whatever veg you have in the fridge for toppings

#### INGREDIENTS

- 6 crumpets
- 4 tbsp passata
- 4 tbsp ketchup
- ½ tsp dried oregano
- Toppings of your choice (peppers, cherry tomatoes, red onion, sweet corn, olives, ham and basil all work well)
- 75g cheddar cheese, grated.

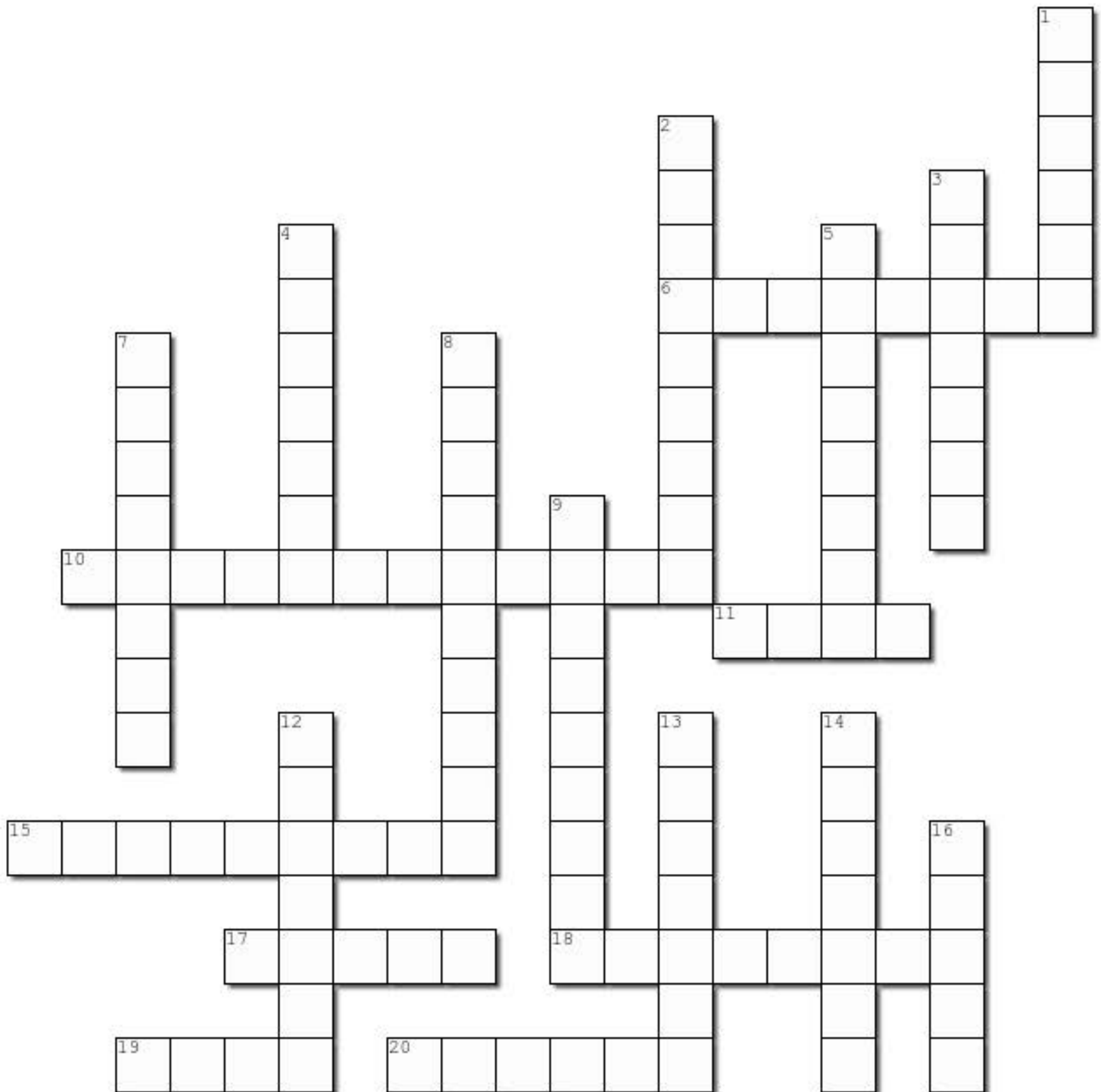


#### METHOD

1. Heat the grill to high. Lightly toast the crumpets in a toaster or under the grill. Meanwhile, mix the passata, ketchup and oregano together in a bowl. Season to taste. Chop your chosen toppings into small pieces – young children can tear basil, or chop soft veg in a cup using safety scissors.
2. Line a baking tray with foil. Spread the sauce over the crumpets, then top with the veg and cheese. Arrange on the tray and grill for 3-4 mins until the cheese is golden and bubbling. Leave to cool slightly before eating!
